The project has a continuum of strategies:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Treatment: Provide geographically accessible and integrated medical and substance use disorder care.</li> <li>2) Recovery: Offer community supports for high-risk populations and people living with mental health and substance use disorders.</li> <li>3) Prevention: Improve community mental well-being by addressing systemic and structural risk factors. The project goal is to increase access to and utilization of treatment, recovery, and prevention services for those affected by behavioral health conditions, including substance use and mental health disorders. <p>Goal 1: Address structural- and system-level barriers to improve Southeast Missouri residents' access to quality, integrated SUD and other behavioral health care services.</p> <p>Goal 2: Improve the quality and sustainability of rural behavioral health care services through supporting rural health care providers to offer coordinated, evidence-based, and trauma-informed SUD and other behavioral health care services.</p> <p>Goal 3: Improve the capacity of the behavioral health care system to address rural community risk factors and social determinants of health affecting the behavioral health of the target rural area.</p> <p>The area has been plagued by hospital closures, including the closing of two rural hospitals: one located in Reynolds County in 2016, and one located in Ripley County in 2018. In addition, Iron County Medical Center (ICMC), a Critical Access Hospital, filed for Chapter 9 bankruptcy in 2018 and is restructuring due to financial losses. Although ICMC remains open, financial challenges persist due to serving an impoverished region. Because of these rural hospital closures, Poplar Bluff Regional Medical Center, located in Poplar Bluff, Missouri, and ICMC are the only hospitals located in the region, so many residents must travel over an hour to access hospital care. Target rural counties are located in the Ozark Mountains, with rolling hills and numerous traversing streams which result in many geographically-isolated areas. Five of the seven counties are considered Level 4 Frontier and Remote Areas, thereby having the highest degree of geographic remoteness. Target area counties are also located in the Missouri Delta Region—an area prone to frequent flooding. Poverty throughout the Delta area</p>

is more than 10% higher than the nation, and counties in the Delta region also have disproportionately worse health outcomes compared to the nation. The combination of scarce resources, pervasive poverty, and substantial risk factors for SUD/OD and mental health issues, as well as overall poor health outcomes of the region, requires emergency responders/law enforcement, health care providers, courts, and community organizations to proactively work together in order to mitigate the adverse effects of opioid use disorder.

**Project Summary**

Vermont is facing crises in its housing and mental health care systems. People with mental health emergencies are regularly boarded in the emergency department for days on end, to the detriment of their long-term health and at a great stress and financial cost to the health care and emergency response systems. At the same time, the state’s housing shortage has become even more acute with housing costs increasingly out of reach for residents. Those most impacted by these parallel crises are Vermont’s most marginalized residents—people without a place to call home, in distress from unmet medical and mental health care needs, and unable to access critical care that could shift their trajectory, improve their health and well-being, and—quite literally—save their lives.

As we struggle to solve these crises, a collaboration of healthcare and human service providers presents a cost-effective, evidence-based solution that holds promise to improve the health and increase the housing stability of marginalized Vermonters while also reducing healthcare costs and stress on emergency services. Windham County’s Brattleboro Memorial Hospital, the Brattleboro Retreat, Groundworks Collaborative, and Health Care & Rehabilitative Services has formed Healthworks ACT, a new model for healthcare delivery to people experiencing homelessness or housing instability. Healthworks ACT will reduce trauma, restore dignity, and improve quality of life for the community’s most marginalized residents.

The overall goal of the Telehealth Outreach for Underserved Communities of Hawaii (TOUCH) grant is to reduce morbidity and mortality related to behavioral health and substance use disorders by bringing together partners to expand access to and quality of substance use disorder and other behavioral health care services in rural communities of Hawaii. The TOUCH project builds directly on the telepsych network created with RCORP funding and emphasizes training and resources not previously addressed by the Hawaii State Rural Health Association.

Special Aim 1: Expand Telehealth infrastructure by doubling the hours of free telehealth services available to rural individuals and families, by introducing:

- 1) warm handoffs from emergency rooms,
- 2) psychiatric Collaborative Care Model consultations,
- 3) virtual withdrawal management, and
- 4) group therapy visits, increasing services to 300 patients a month and thereby decreasing psychiatric hospital admissions by 2%.

Specific Aim 2: Improve the quality and sustainability of rural behavioral health care services through education and care coordination by supporting 6,000 person-hours of substance use disorder and mental health continuing education, 1,000 hours of rural clinical training for health professions students that includes coordinating care for those in need including homeless and those released from incarceration to result in reduced recidivism and a 5% increase in behavioral health workforce. Specific Aim 3: Improve the capacity of rural communities to address risk factors and social determinants of health that affect the behavioral health of rural residents by providing outreach and community education on resiliency, parenting, substance use prevention to 1,000 community members a year and creating local task forces to develop plans for brick-and-mortar recovery communities, resulting in a 2% decrease in substance use. Activities include expanding the free HawaiiUTelehealth.org program to provide 3,600 tele-visits a year to rural residents, including services such as outpatient withdrawal management, warm handoffs from hospitals and clinics to mental health experts, and creating group support sessions training social worker, community health worker, psychology, nurse practitioner, and medical trainees in rural areas to learn the needs and benefits of working in such an area, create a culture of care coordination, resource sharing and communication with the TOUCH students and providers that extends throughout rural communities and prisons/jails, and instill community based, trauma-informed resiliency training, parenting skills and substance use prevention knowledge to 1,000 community members a year. Evaluation will be based on number of visits and trainings, attendance at activities, web hits, telehealth utilization statistics, the size of the workforce, rates of substance use, number of recovery beds, number of emergency visits and admissions for behavioral health and substance use causes, recidivism and deaths from overdose or suicide.

According to the 2021 Healthy Youth Survey, Kittitas County has a higher percentage of 10th graders with more than four Adverse Childhood Experiences compared to the state and reported higher numbers of 10th graders who have attempted suicide 4-5 times in the last 12 months. Between 2018 and 2020, Kittitas County saw 8.5 opioid-related deaths per 100,000, 2.5 deaths per 100,000 higher than the United States overall. In 2021, the number of opioid related deaths per 100,000 in Kittitas County rose to 17.1.

To address barriers to accessing treatment services, this project plans to convene and facilitate a monthly Behavioral Health work group comprised of cross-sector organizations and recruit people with lived experience to be included in decision making. In addition, the project will address the LGBTQIA+ at-risk group by increasing staffing and mentoring services. Finally, the Network will establish closed loop referrals through care coordination for SUD and Behavioral Health treatment.

To improve quality and sustainability of services, this project aims to implement evidence-based practices including Mental Health First Aid training and ACEs training. In addition, aligning with promising practices, this project looks to increase opportunities to participate in innovative therapy through the creation of Art Therapy classes and providing training for staff to complete the Equine Assisted Growth and Learning Association (EAGALA) therapy training.

To improve the capacity of the behavioral health care system, this project aims to expand the workforce in Kittitas County by increasing school-based therapists by 2.0 FTE and hiring a Care Coordinator with a behavioral health background. The Network will also conduct educational and enrichment opportunities at the Recovery Community Organization to support the social determinants of health. This project will provide quarterly safe space trainings for community businesses and organizations. Finally, the Network will provide support for those needing childcare to be able to attend treatment and recovery resources.

<p><b>Project Summary</b></p> <p>Ohio has been at the forefront of the addiction crisis since the opiate epidemic emerged in the early 2000's. Butler County's 204 unintentional drug overdose deaths accounted for 4.1% of the state's overall total in 2020. Oxford Township is a HRSA-designated rural area located within Butler County. Oxford Township has an approximate population of 23,035, comprising approximately 5.9% of the population of Butler County. However, due to its rural nature, this area faces unique challenges in prevention, treatment, and recovery efforts for both mental health and substance use disorders within the community. In Oxford Township, there are just over 3,000 students enrolled in K-12 in the Talawanda School District, as well as over 18,800 students from 50 states and 79 countries enrolled at Miami University. This unique mix of community members, K-12 students, and a diverse university population poses the need for a multi-system network of community and school resources, as well as integration of services as these populations interact every day. Oxford Township also faces challenges due to a 45.1% poverty level. To address the needs of this community, a seven-member consortium team will be convened, representing education, healthcare, and prevention. The consortium members will implement prevention, treatment, and recovery initiatives that address both mental health and substance use, individually addressing the needs of the educational, healthcare, and treatment sectors while also building collaborations and relationships with other sectors, such as social services and first responders.</p>

#### Project Summary

The Health Promotion Resource Center (HPRC) at Morehouse School of Medicine (MSM) proposes to implement Better Health and Fitness Together (BhFiT) in West Central and East Central Georgia. BhFiT will improve behavioral health services to vulnerable and disparate low-income African American adults and adolescents in the target area. While African Americans comprise 46% of the target area, they only account for approximately 25% of the treatment population despite high need. The Peer Recovery Expansion Project (PREP) is a collaboration of sixteen consortium members aimed at improving access to and quality of treatment for substance use disorder (SUD) and other behavioral health conditions in HRSA designated rural service areas across five Pennsylvania counties. Through partnering hospitals with Single County Authorities and subject matter experts, PREP aims to develop a standardized approach to utilization and integration of Peer Recovery Specialists, cross-trained in behavioral health, and Case Managers in hospital emergency departments for patients that may need SUD and behavioral health services. **Project Summary**

Rural communities in Utah are at risk of higher rates of SUD and have unique behavioral health needs. Access to SUD/ODU prevention, treatment, and behavioral health recovery services are limited due to lack of providers and geographical isolation. The Utah Rural Opioid Healthcare Consortium – Collaborative Care Model (UROHC-CCM) brings existing and new partners together to build sustainable models for SUD/ODU prevention, treatment, and recovery in three rural Utah counties. UROHC-CCM’s activities match with the RCORP-BHS goals directly through intentional plans:

1. To develop health professions workforce capacity in Utah. An annual Rural SUD Student Summit will train health professions students from Utah colleges and universities in topics of rural health, as well as SUD prevention, treatment and recovery. The Summit will address structural- and systems-level barriers to improve rural residents’ access to SUD and behavioral health care services by increasing the workforce capacity.
2. To prepare and sustain interprofessional rural primary care SUD treatment teams. UROHC-CCM will train six rural primary care clinic RN and provider teams to utilize a collaborative care model (CCM) for office-based addiction treatment. Interprofessional clinic teams will be trained and supported by a rural SUD Project ECHO.
3. To support rural communities in providing SUD risk prevention and treatment.

UCRH/SUAHEC, Utah State University (USU) extension, Utah Support Advocates for Recovery Awareness (USARA) and Association for Utah Community Health (AUCH) will build on SUD resources already in place in the three rural counties to address community risk factors and social determinants of health that affect behavioral health of rural residents. Programs to address these factors include Mental Health First Aid training, peer recovery services, and Strengthening Families programs.
